We will offer a Family Service at 9:30 am on both Rosh Hashanah and Yom Kippur morning. This will be a shorter, musical, and engaging service for the whole family. It will also feature interactive conversation rather than a full sermon. It is an opportunity to experience the themes and melodies of the High Holy Days in an age-appropriate way which is appealing for children and adults alike.

Accessibility:

Handicapped Seating: Ushers will guide you to a comfortable location. If you need any other type of assistance, please let us know in advance.

Tashlich:

Tashlich is a ritual that many Jews observe during Rosh Hashanah. "Tashlich" means "casting off" in Hebrew and involves symbolically casting off the sins of the previous year by tossing pieces of bread into a body of flowing water. Just as the water carries away the bits of bread, so to are the sins symbolically carried away. In this way, the participant hopes to start the New Year with a clean slate.

Hunger Project:

Every year Temple Solel sponsors a food drive. Grocery bags will be available following Rosh Hashanah services. Please pick one up, fill it with non-perishable food items and return it to Temple Solel on Yom Kippur. The food will be distributed by Vista del Camino in Scottsdale. Additionally, as in the past, we'll have an opportunity to support MAZON - A Jewish Response to Hunger.

Temperature:
